## **Ten Basic Poetry and Literary Elements**

- 1. Simile a comparison of two unlike things using 'like' or 'as'.
  - Example: "Some issues need to be addressed like envelopes"
    - Andre 3000 "13<sup>th</sup> Floor/Growing Old" on Atliens
- 2. Metaphor a comparison of two unlike things without using like or as
  - Example: "God's a seamstress who tailorfitted my pain"
    - 50 Cent "Patiently Waiting" on Get Rich or Die Tryin'
- **3. Personification** an inanimate object is given human like characteristic
  - Example: "Yo, <u>if rap gets jealous</u>, words that were admitted // I used to be a public enemy, don't forget it"
    - K'naan "If Rap Gets Jealous"
- **4. Hyperbole** a great exaggeration
  - Example: "Put food on the table, fed the whole city"
    - Rick Ross "Valley of Death" on Deeper Than Rap
- **5. Alliteration** –at the beginning of words, there is a repetition of consonants
  - Example: "<u>C</u>uz it's <u>c</u>ool when ya <u>c</u>ause a <u>c</u>ozy <u>c</u>onditionin' // Which we <u>c</u>reate, <u>c</u>uz that's our mission"
    - Snoop Dogg "Lodi Dodi" on *Doggystyle*
- **6. Assonance** anywhere in the words, there is a repetition of vowels
  - Example: "Socrates' philosophies and hypotheses can't define how I be droppin' these mockeries."
    - Inspectah Deck "Triumph" on Wu-Tang Forever
- 7. Consonance anywhere in words, there is repetition of consonant sounds
  - Example: "The most meanest emcee on this -- on this Earth"
    - Eminem "The Way I Am" on The Marshall Mathers LP
- 8. Onomatopoeia words that sound like the name of the word
  - Example: "I'll make you say, 'wee ohh wee ohh wee, wee ohh wee, wee ohh wee,' like a cop car."
    - Lil Wayne "Mrs. Officer" on Tha Carter III
- **9. Repetition** words or phrases are repeated
  - Example: "I'm educated but I'm dumb on that <u>microphone</u> // Don't even bother, you'll get done on that <u>microphone</u> // I turn a father to a son on that <u>microphone</u>."
    - Joell Ortiz "Microphone" on Slaughterhouse
- 10. Rhyme sound alike endings of words
  - **a.** End rhyme At the end of lines, words rhyme.
    - Example: "Dress smart like a London <u>bloke</u> // Before he speak, his suit <u>bespoke</u>."
    - Kanye West "American Boy"
  - **b.** Internal rhyme Words that rhyme are in the middle of the line.
    - Example: "My function is to make much 'n' lay back munchin"
    - Jay-Z "Can't Knock the Hustle" on Reasonable Doubt
